Our School Logo

The significance and symbolism of our school logo is:

- The **tree** of knowledge (e.g. seen in St John's church)
- The **trunk** is an image of St John's Cross to symbolise our name Saint of John the Baptist
- The **figures** represent children at school and at home with both working in partnership
- The **book** represents the learning that takes place at school and the lunch box the sustenance provided at home
- The **rainbow**, which is in the shape of a book represents the richness and diversity of all who attend St John's and its shape symbolises The Bible as the source of our vision and values
- The **blue** in the rainbow signifies the River Jordan, the river in which John baptised Jesus and represents the fact that we are all washed clean and have a fresh start every day
